The difference between gold and bitcoin is that gold cannot be hacked by Russian hackers, while bitcoin has an inherent fault in the RSA crypto-technology. Once quantum computers roll out bitcoin is stuffed unless they make fundamental changes. Basically bitcoin relies on the RSA encryption, just like https (secure web pages), and this relies on the computational difficulty of factoring numbers into their primes. Quantum computers will change all that. It will be easy to factor numbers into their primes, which voids the security of the RSA encryption. The public key of bitcoin is public, and when you have quantum computers you can find out the private key (the holy grail of each bitcoin wallet) and with the private key you can claim ownership to the whole bitcoin wallet with all money that are described in the blockchain with that private key. Total chaos once quantum computers become mainstream. Of course you can try to prosecute those that try to steal money, but since the money is anonymous it will be very difficult.
